6. Exhibit tickets will be issued for each entry and must be firmly and conspicuously attached to exhibit.
7. If equal 1st prize awarded, no 2nd prize to be given.
8. No prize money for 1st place will be given where a trophy is awarded.
9. Show Committee can use their discretion to award trophies instead of prize money.
10. All prizes awarded are at the judges discretion and no correspondence will be entered into regarding any judging decision.
11. Special conditions or instructions relating to each section are contained on the pages related to those sections. Those conditions and instructions form part of the conditions of entry.
12. No person except Officials allowed in room while judging is in progress.
13. The Committee has the power to eject any person from the building or ground.
14. Stewards have the power to re-allocate exhibits if in their opinion wrongly classed.

2 cups s.r. flour
pinch salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
3/4 cup milk
2/3 cup Tasmanian Golden Nectar Real Leatherwood Honey
1/2 cup light olive oil
2 eggs—lightly beaten
3/4 cup chopped walnuts.
Icing Sugar for dusting.

Preheat oven to 170C.
Place 12 paper patty pans in 12 large muffin tins.
In a large bowl, sift flour, salt and cinnamon.
Warm the honey in bowl in a microwave for 20 seconds and remove.
Whisk in the milk, oil and eggs, stir in walnuts. Using a wooden spoon, stir liquid mixture into the dry ingredients gently.
Stir only for 30 seconds and do not over beat.
Spoon into patty pans.
Bake for 23 minutes or until cooked.
Cool for a few minutes then remove.
Dust with icing sugar.
